Lord, you have called us to serve you. Grant that we may walk in your presence: your love in our hearts, your truth in our minds, your strength in our wills; until, at the end of our journey, we know the joy of our homecoming and the welcome of your embrace, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Now, in the power of endless life Christ is risen from the grave.

His death has broken death and opened for us the new and living way.

Christ is now our peace, our freedom and our joy.

And so, we join with the angels and all the company of heaven as we sing:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosannah in the highest. Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosannah in the highest.

Glory and honor and praise to you, holy and living God. Living among us, Jesus loved us.

We celebrate our redemption with this bread of life and cup of salvation. Accept our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving which we offer to you through Christ. Pour out your Spirit upon these gifts of bread and wine, that they may be to us the body and blood of Christ, and that we, filled with the Spirit's grace and power, may be renewed for the service of your kingdom.

United in Christ with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, O God, in songs of everlasting praise.

Blessed are You, now and forever. Amen.

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your Name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us.
